We are so blessed to be members of the South Georgia Community. In 2007, The Community Foundation of South Georgia grew to be one of the largest community foundations in the Southeastern Region. The substantial growth of its assets enabled it to become a significant source of grants that were distributed primarily throughout the South Georgia Community. While we as a nation saw a highly volatile stock market and slower economic growth than in years past, we still experienced the second highest year of charitable donations to and through The Community Foundation.

We get excited every time a dollar passes through the Foundation doors because it is immediately put into action meeting local needs. You can share the excitement knowing that your gifts have an immediate impact and contribute to future growth and provisions for decades and generations to come. That growth is a testament to our donors because they believe that The Community Foundation is the best place for stewardship of their philanthropic funds.

This report will hopefully convey a simple but resounding message: We are here to serve YOU. We are here to build relationships.

In 2007, we exceeded \$58 Million in assets and granted over \$6.4 Million for our communities' needs. We experienced an exceptional year of gifts exceeding \$10 Million, managed over 230 funds, granted 48 scholarships and partnered with 50 nonprofit organizations on their endowments. We also added 19 new funds to our list of partners.

WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION OF SOUTH GEORGIA?

The Community Foundation of South Georgia is a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization actively involved in making the South Georgia Community a better place to live. The CFSGA is an entity that gathers assets and ideas and serves a defined geographic area. We assist individuals, families, and businesses establish and manage charitable funds. We partner with nonprofit organizations by helping them establish, maintain, and build endowment funds for their organization. We are a tax-exempt, nonprofit, publicly supported, philanthropic institution with a long term goal of building permanent, named component funds established by many separate donors to carry out their charitable interests. We are a service foundation for a defined geographic area of 35 counties which form our South Georgia Community. We provide guidance for professionals as they seek advantageous avenues for their client's asset portfolios. We receive assets, manage and invest these resources so that they multiply, and make grants to qualifying nonprofit organizations throughout South Georgia.

Why Establish a Fund with Community Foundation of South Georgia?

Simplicity – It's easy to give to and through the Community Foundation. There are no IRS required minimum distributions. We handle all the necessary paperwork, acknowledgements and administration.

Flexibility – The Community Foundation is unique in its ability to offer individualized giving programs for any type of donor, be it an individual, family, business or civic club.

Convenience – It is a very simple process to create a fund with the Foundation and the continued relationship remains as easy throughout the life of the fund. We handle all of the administrative tasks and legal requirements.

Donor Choice – You direct your gifts to the program, organization, or interest of your choice.

Tax Benefits – The Community Foundation is a public nonprofit charitable organization under the IRS code, thereby offering the maximum charitable tax deduction allowed.

Recognition or Anonymity – When a gift is distributed from your fund, you may choose to receive recognition or remain completely anonymous.

Stewardship and Accountability – We provide full accountability to the community and our Board of Trustees on a regular basis through comprehensive financial reports that are completed and reviewed by independent auditors.

Permanence – A gift to the Community Foundation can benefit the community in perpetuity if you desire. Donors have the confidence that the funds are being managed and are able to meet changing needs.

Satisfaction – People desire to help others and to fulfill a charitable vision within their hearts. The CFSGA seeks to implement and perpetuate these visions and to facilitate the humanitarian efforts of each donor.

Types of Charitable Funds at The Community Foundation

Unrestricted Funds - These funds allow the Community Foundation to respond to disaster relief, new programs, emerging needs, and innovative solutions that might not be started, or might not continue, were it not for The Community Foundation. This enables the foundation to immediately intersect resources with community needs. Unrestricted funds are long term, which are intended to benefit the South Georgia Community Forever.

Donor Advised Funds - This type of fund provides maximum convenience and flexibility by enabling donors to make contributions to charitable organizations. Through the creation of this fund, donors can make recommendations for distributions to specific charities. It is especially useful for donors who want to take a charitable deduction one year and make distributions over several years. This fund allows donors to support numerous charities of their choice through one simple donation.

Field of Interest Funds - This fund allows donors to support broad areas of concern, such as education, the arts, the environment, youth services or the aged. The Foundation then makes grants to the most appropriate programs or organizations within the specified field of interest. Donors may also direct that grants be made only to a specific geographic area within the state.


Designated Funds - This fund is held by the Community Foundation where the donor has specified that the fund's income or assets be used for the benefit of one or more specific public charities. This fund type ensures that support will be provided to specific eligible organizations that donors name. Donors may establish a designated fund to endow the charitable giving that they've enjoyed throughout their lifetimes.

Agency Endowment Funds - This fund type is created by a non-profit as a means of protecting charitable dollars for the future of their work and their mission. Through an endowment within The Community Foundation, a non-profit seeks to build and secure endowment funds and to receive prudent stewardship of their funds. Although an Agency Endowment Fund can only be established by the non-profit agency itself, donations by others to these funds are welcome.

Scholarship Funds - This fund enables students to pursue academic goals and can be established by companies, organizations, families, and individuals. These funds may have broad merit or need based criteria or be designed to address students of a certain school, a certain community, and/or those undertaking certain fields of study in a post-secondary educational institution.

Memorial Fund - This fund can be established according to any of the aforementioned funds. Grant distributions from this fund will memorialize a loved one in perpetuity.

Custom Funds - We recognize that there may be circumstances in which we will need to design and customize a fund to meet a donor's needs. We ensure that all custom funds meet legal and IRS guidelines. We will partner our professionals with your planners to ensure integrity.



Planned Giving

Planned Giving is as simple as it sounds; it refers to any type of charitable gift that is planned before actually given. It is a gift that requires consideration and planning in light of the donor's overall estate strategy. Planned gifts are usually deferred, meaning they are arranged now and fulfilled later. There are numerous planned giving vehicles and combinations that allow a gift to be tailored to meet a donor's needs or desires. Indeed, one the of truly fulfilling aspects of charitable gift planning is the adventure of helping donors find and, in cooperation with the appropriate advisors, construct the best plan for everyone concerned. Benefits of Planned Gifts include:

- Lifetime income possibilities
- Avoiding capital gains taxes
- Reduction of estate and/or income taxes
- Simplicity of asset transfer to loved ones
- Ability to make significant, meaningful and permanent gifts to your charity
- Increase current income to self or others



Types of Planned Gifts

Bequest — When a donor decides to leave assets to charity in her will, she is making a bequest. The donor's estate will receive a charitable estate tax deduction at her death, when the gift is made to charity.

Gift Annuity — A gift annuity is a contract between a charity and a donor. In return for a donation of cash or other assets, the charity agrees to pay a fixed payment for life to the donor or to a friend or family member of the donor's choosing. The donor also can claim a charitable tax deduction. If a donor funds a gift annuity with long-term capital gain property, the donor will have to report only some of the gain, and may be able to report it in installments over many years.

** Income from a gift annuity can be deferred for a period of years. Deferred gift annuities are often set up by younger donors to supplement retirement income.

Charitable Remainder Trust — This trust makes payments, either a fixed amount (annuity trust) or a percentage of trust principal (unitrust), to whomever the donor chooses to receive income. The donor may claim a charitable income tax deduction and may not have to pay any capital gains tax if the gift is of appreciated property. At the end of the trust term, the charity receives whatever amount is left in the trust.

** Charitable remainder unitrusts provide some flexibility in the distribution of income, and thus can be helpful in retirement planning.

Charitable Lead Trust — This trust makes payments, either a fixed amount (annuity trust) or a percentage of trust principal (unitrust), to charity during its term. At the end of the trust term, the principal can either go back to the donor (a grantor lead trust) or to heirs named by the donor (a non-grantor lead trust). The donor may claim a charitable income tax deduction for funding a grantor lead trust or a charitable gift tax deduction for funding a non-grantor lead trust. Since

lead trusts are typically used to pass assets to heirs, non-grantor lead trusts are far more common than grantor lead trusts.

Retained Life Estate — A donor may make a gift of his personal residence or farm to charity and retain the right to live there for the remainder of his or her life. The donor receives an immediate income tax deduction for the gift. At the donor's death, the charity can use or sell the property.

IRA Retirement Plan – A 401(k), 403 (b), IRA, or other such account, if passed on to heirs, are heavily taxed. The Community Foundation can be named as the beneficiary of your retirement plan to benefit your charitable organization through a donor advised fund. Removing the asset from the donor's estate can significantly reduce the inheritance tax.

Life Insurance - A policy that may have been held for many years and is no longer needed for the financial security of your heirs or establishing a new policy can also be a giving opportunity. The Community Foundation can be named as the owner and beneficiary of the policy and since the Community Foundation becomes the owner of the policy, the proceeds will not be included in your estate for tax purposes. Tax deductible contributions can be made to cover the premium and a fund is established to support the donor's charitable goals in perpetuity.

Planned Giving assures long term growth and provision. Having the correct plan for you will balance what you wish to accomplish for yourself, your family, and your charitable interests in your overall estate and financial plans.






